





"I started playing soccer when I was 5, joined my first competitive team when I was 8, went to my first professional game when I was 10, met my idol Mia Hamm when I was 12, and then quit playing when I was 16.

Being a gay teen in the midwest wasn't easy, and being a gay teen athlete was even harder. I felt like I had to choose between my identity as an athlete and my identity as gay. The sport had lost its joy for me. I went ten years without ever touching a soccer ball, and truly never thought I'd play again.

But when I moved to California in 2015, I was lucky enough to find a whole community of gay soccer players - first through the San Francisco Spikes and now through the West Hollywood Soccer Club. Being a WHSC member has offered me a place to play soccer at a competitive level (both locally in LA and traveling to tournaments), hone my skills during practices and drills, and find a community of teammates and friends who make me feel safe, included, and valued."
